

The following is a walk through for the installation and configuration of the Mac Cisco Client VPN.

Please contact support if you require the username/password to download the software.

Step 1: Download the Cisco VPN client here.

Step 2: After the download is complete, double click on the file and begin installation.



Step 3: Once the file is extracted, the installer will start automatically. Simply double click the open box as indicated.



Step 4: As indicated, this portion of the installation will determine if you already have the software installed. Click "Continue" to start this process.



Step 5: Now you must verify if you have a supported version of Mac OS X. Simply click on the "Apple" in the top left corner of your screen and then click "About This Mac".



Step 6: Once your have verified your version, close the "About This Mac" window and click "Continue" to begin the installation process.



Step 7: Accept the license agreement by clicking "Continue".



Step 8: Accept the license agreement AGAIN by clicking "Agree".



Step 9: Select where you would like to install the software and click "Continue".



Step 10: Confirm installation by clicking "Install".



Step 11: To complete the installation process click "Close".



Step 12: To launch the client VPN software, click "Finder" and then "Applications". Scroll to the bottom of the list and double click the "VPNClient" icon.



Step 13: Once the program is loaded, simply begin configuration by clicking "New".



Step 14: Input the necessary information into the marked fields. This information will be provided by Vianet. Once this is completed, click "Save".

Step 15: Now simply select the connection you have just created and click "Connect".



Step 16: The software will now prompt you for your individual username/password. Input this information and click "OK".



Step 17: Once connected, you will see a lock on the left hand side of the "Connection Entry".



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
